Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Vista Meadows Academy. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

VMA was founded on the belief that all children can learn if provided a nurturing and challenging environment where expectations are high and support is bountiful. VMA is a highly specialized environment catering specifically to the needs of students, whom for any reasons have already disengaged from learning within a

traditional school setting. To that end, we commit ourselves to the following core values:

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Academy enrollment is open to all individuals who reside in Michigan. Except for a foreign exchange student who is not a United States citizen, a public school academy shall not enroll a pupil who is not a Michigan resident. Open enrollment is from the beginning of April to the end of May. If applicable, the lottery selection process occurs at the end of the open enrollment period.
